- You will receive the question paper in the Google Classroom.

- Duration - 90 minutes
- Maximum Marks - 40

- OMR sheets for marking answers will be uploaded in the Google Classroom in advance. Take the prints prior to the exam.
- **HOW TO MARK THE ANSWERS IN THE OMR SHEET**
  - 1) Use Black/Blue ball point pen only to write on the Answer sheet.
  - 2) Read the questions carefully and decide on the correct answers.
  - 3) You have 4 options- a, b, c and d
  - 4) Once you decide on the correct option darken the bubble with black/blue ball point pen only.
  - 5) An additional blank space(square) given after the 4 options is to be used only in the following cases:  
While revising the answers if a student realises that he/she has marked a wrong choice, the student may strike it off, darken the correct circle and write the same (a, b, c, d) in the additional blank space.  
**In any other cases, the blank space should not be used**
- **In each section the candidate is expected to attempt only those number of questions as per the instructions. Even if you attempt more questions only the required number (in the order) will be considered for evaluation.**
- Save your mobile data/Wi-Fi for the exam.
- **EXAM TIMINGS**
  - 2.45 pm - Joining time
  - 2.45 am to 2.50 pm - Attendance marking
  - 2.50 pm to 3.00 pm - Cool off time (Fill OMR sheet)
  - 3.00 pm to 4.30 pm - Writing time
  - 4.30 pm to 4.40 pm- Uploading the **scanned OMR sheet** to the Google Classroom.
- **Parent has to sign as the invigilator on the OMR sheet.**
- After doing this, keep the OMR sheet (hard copy) in a sealed envelope under the custody of the parent. This should be done after each exam. After the completion of all the subjects, these envelopes should be put into another envelope with the name of the student, class and division written on it and to be brought to the school on **1<sup>st</sup> November as the valuation is centralised.**
- If you are unable to submit the answer sheets on the specified day, inform the class teacher well in advance. Parents from containment zone need not bring it to the school but send it through speed post or courier.
- **Parent's strict supervision is mandatory to avoid unfair means.**
